Following your arrival into the renowned and spectacular Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe (NB: extra supplement payable if you wish to join from Livingstone), the tour will take in breathtaking views of rivers, delta, salt pan, game reserves, ruins and more! This Adventure tour allows you to touch and embrace the magic of Botswana and Zimbabwe and leave you with a desire to discover more of this dynamic and diverse continent.

### Intended Itinerary

#### Day 1:

#### Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe\* – Chobe National Park, Botswana

Distance travelled: +/-80km

Approx driving day: Half day

We leave Victoria Falls (Zimbabwe) you transferred to the Botswanan border to join your safari guide and vehicle and travel the short distance to Kasane. We arrive in the small town of Kasane, set up camp and prepare for our afternoon safari into Chobe National Park. With sun block and cameras in hand we board our safari vehicle in search of lion, leopard, hyena, elephant, giraffe and a host of antelope and bird species while snaking our way through the sandy tracks and rugged terrain. Chobe National Park was the first national park to be established in Botswana and by size; it is the third largest park in the country. The Chobe River is one of Africa's most beautiful and supports a huge concentration of animals. We scan the horizon and riverbanks in search of scattered wildlife seeking water as night falls. Happy and content, we relax the night under the African skies.

\*For a supplement you can start your tour in Livingstone, Zambia.

**Wow Factors:** Chobe National Park, Chobe River, afternoon game drive.

**Accommodation:** Camping twin share dome tents with shared facilities including camp stretcher beds and sleeping bag.

**Campsite:** remote wilderness campsite

**Meals included:** Lunch, Dinner

#### Day 2:

#### Chobe National Park -Savuti/ Linyanti Areas

Distance travelled: +/- 160km

Approx driving day: Full day game driving. Typically this comprises of a 2 hour drive in the morning after leaving camp, followed by 4-5 hour transfer to the Savuti area, and a further 2-3 hour game drive.

Accessible by 4x4 wheel drive only, we head deep into south west corner of Chobe National Park to Savuti Marsh, a relic of a large inland lake fed occasionally by the Savuti Channel. This region is made up of rolling savannah which attracts many different species of antelope, zebra, wildebeest, buffalo and elephant. These in turn attract many predators including lion, leopard, hyena and wild dog and cheetah. This is a breathtaking game driving day and the inaccessibility of the region offers a throwback of what safari experience might have been like in yesteryear. Camping out in the wild enhances further the feeling of exhilaration at being so close to remote and untamed Mother Nature.

**Wow Factors:** Chobe National Park, Savuti/ Linyanti area, Game drives

**Accommodation:** Camping twin share dome tents with shared facilities including camp stretcher beds and sleeping bags

**Campsite:** remote wilderness campsite

**Meals included:** Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

#### Day 3:

#### Moremi Game Reserve/Adjacent Community Game

Management area.

Distance travelled: +/- 100km

Approx driving day: Half day



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Nestled up against the Okavango Delta waters is the Moremi Game Reserve. Smaller and less frequently visited than Chobe it nevertheless offers superb game viewing. The combination of different habitats from Mopane woodland to Acacia forest, floodplains and lagoons make the area a place of stunning beauty, supporting a diverse array of wildlife. Sightings of leopard, wild dog, cheetah and lion common, as are elephant, giraffe and zebra encounters. Common nighttime visitors to our camp are the spotted hyena and the honey badger. Conditions dependant, a night drive is conducted in this area. At certain times of the year it may be preferable / safer (as well as offer better game viewing) to visit an adjacent game management area instead of Moremi.

**Wow Factors:** Early Morning game drive and transfer to reach the Moremi area or adjacent game management area.

**Accommodation:** Camping twin share dome tents with shared facilities including camp stretcher beds and sleeping bags

**Campsite:** remote wilderness campsite

**Meals included:** Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

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### Day 4:

#### Moremi – Maun

Distance travelled: +/-150km

Approx driving day: Full day

We enjoy an early morning game drive, returning to camp mid morning to pack our camp and head for Maun, the gateway to the Okavango Delta. Maun is the hub of the tourism industry in Botswana and the road from Moremi to Maun traverses huge areas of protected community land crossing the buffalo fence (the fence circles the entire southern section of the delta to protect it from cattle encroachment). The surrounding areas of Maun give you an opportunity to witness rural life at its best with folks working the land and tending their cattle.

**Wow Factors:** Early morning game drive in the Moremi Area, Rural Botswana, Maun

**Accommodation:** Camping twin share dome tents with shared facilities including camp stretcher beds and sleeping bags

**Campsite:** remote wilderness campsite

**Meals included:** Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

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### Day 5:

#### Maun - Okavango Delta - Maun

Distance travelled: +/-30 km

A leisurely departure from camp brings us to the Okavango Delta. The Okavango is a natural wetland system spreading over some

1.6 million hectares of northern Botswana. The 'delta' results from rivers flowing south from Angola, dividing repeatedly on the flat Botswana plains and forming an intricate floodplain of river channels, lagoons and isolated islands - an inland 'delta', the only one of its kind in Africa. We enjoy a day in the wilderness with experienced and knowledgeable 'polers' who guide you through the labyrinths of channels in a dug-out canoe (mokoro). If we are lucky we may spot wildlife, in particular hippo, crocodile, buffalo, elephant and a huge number of birds, but the experience is focused on the amazing watercourses and beauty of this one-of-a-kind natural wonder.

**Wow Factors:** Excursion in the Okavango Delta by Mokoro

**Accommodation:** Camping twin share dome tents with shared facilities including camp stretcher beds and sleeping bags

**Campsite:** remote wilderness campsite

**Meals included:** Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

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### Day 6:

#### Maun- Makgadikgadi Pans

Distance travelled: +/-200km paved road (seasonally dependant)

Approx driving day: Half day

From Maun we travel to the Makgadikgadi Pans stopping on route at the charismatic village of Gweta then continue south to Chapman's Baobabs. The Baobabs have a circumference of over 25 m and act as sentinels over the distance pans. The Makgadikgadi Pans is a vast shimmering salt flats on the edge of the Kalahari Desert. We camp for the night on the pans near Nata. Sleeping out on the 'Pans' under a blanket of stars is a real 'Africa' experience – not to be missed.

**N.B: Due to the rainy season in Botswana (mainly between January - March), we may not camp at the Makgadikgadi Pans. We may move our destination to Nata where we will overnight and wake early for an opportunity to see the Flamingo's at the Flamingo sanctuary. Also not to be missed!**

**Wow Factors:** Chapman's Baobabs, Makgadikgadi Pans, Stargazing and sleeping out on the salt pans

**Accommodation:** Camping twin share dome tents with shared facilities including camp stretcher beds and sleeping bags

**Campsite:** remote wilderness campsite

**Meals included:** Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

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### Day 7:

#### Makgadikgadi Pans – Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe\*

Distance travelled: +/-300km

Approx driving day: Full day



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We depart in the morning and travel back towards Kasane. We meander through vast open savannahs passing many local villages before saying goodbye to our guide and transfer vehicles once again at the border before crossing into Zimbabwe for the final journey to Victoria Falls. En route keep your eyes peeled for wildlife migrating between Chobe National Park and the nearby Hwange National Park (in Zimbabwe).

**Wow Factors:** Rural Botswana and Zimbabwe, Roaming wildlife, Victoria Falls Township

**Accommodation:** Tourist class hostel

**Meals included:** Breakfast, Lunch

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### Day 8:

#### Victoria Falls, Zimbabwe – Bulawayo

Distance travelled: +/-450km

Approx driving day: Half day

Departing Victoria Falls we drive south for Bulawayo, Zimbabwe's second city. The afternoon is yours to explore at leisure. Bulawayo is a pleasant city with broad tree-lined avenues and wide open spaces. There is a fascinating National History Museum, which recounts much of Zimbabwe's traditional and colonial past; also near the Old Town Hall there is a lively curio market where you can test your bartering skills to see if you can get a bargain. A wide array of handicrafts and artwork are on display here made by skilful local craftsmen and women.

**Wow Factors:** Victoria Falls, Bulawayo

**Accommodation:** Camping twin share dome tents with shared facilities

**Meals included:** Lunch, Dinner

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### Day 9:

#### Bulawayo – Matopos National Park - Bulawayo

Distance travelled: +/- 200km

Approx driving day: Full day game driving

Matopos National Park is located a short distance outside Bulawayo and knowledgeable guides will take us to this very beautiful park. The wind-sculptured Matobo Hills are the site of numerous Bushman paintings and the area holds a special cultural and spiritual importance to the indigenous people here. The reserve has the largest concentration of Black and White Rhino in Africa and provided conditions are right our guides will lead us on foot to some of the more concealed places in search of these magnificent animals. Approaching these huge herbivores is a heart racing, breathtaking and memorable experience. The park

also has the densest population of leopard and black eagle in the world and we keep our eyes peeled high and low for these creatures. We also keep a look out for giraffe, zebra, ostrich and a variety of antelope and buck species. We return to Bulawayo where there is the option of going into town and checking out the nightlife.

**Wow Factors:** Motopos National Park, Game drives, Rhino tracking

**Accommodation:** Camping twin share dome tents with shared facilities

**Meals included:** Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

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### Day 10:

#### Bulawayo – Great Zimbabwe National Monument

Distance travelled: +/- 350km

Approx driving day: Half day

Leaving Bulawayo we cross towards the east of the country to the small town of Masvingo. Nearby is one of the most important archaeological sites in Southern Africa: the Great Zimbabwe National Monument. Dating back to 1200AD this place was once the home to an indigenous population of some 10,000 people. A UNESCO World Heritage Site the area holds special significance to the country which took its name. Legend says this was the city where the Queen of Sheba resided and archeological finds uncovered gold, coins and porcelain from as far afield as Persia and China, highlighting the importance of the city as a trading post. We camp nearby for easy access and ample time to explore the ruins at leisure. If you have the energy there is the opportunity to trek to the top of the Hill Enclosure to enjoy a wondrous and spiritual African sunset.

**Wow Factors:** Masvingo, Great Zimbabwe National Monument

**Accommodation:** Camping twin share dome tents with shared facilities

**Meals included:** Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

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### Day 11:

#### Great Zimbabwe National Monument – Antelope Park

Distance travelled: 250km

Approx driving day: Half day

Located on Zimbabwe's central plateau, we pass through the town of Gweru and make camp at the Antelope Park Private Game Reserve. This is home to numerous antelope as well as zebra and giraffe. There is the opportunity to try various (optional) activities here including game drives, game walks,



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elephant back riding, river cruise, horse riding or even to try “Walking with the Lions” where you “join the pride” and venture out into the bush with several 6-18 month old lion cubs. Walk where they walk and go where they go; enjoy their play and exploration of their world – a unique ‘Africa’ experience.

**Wow Factors:** *Antelope Park, Optional activities*

**Accommodation:** *Camping twin share dome tents with shared facilities*

**Meals included:** *Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner*

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### Day 12:

#### Antelope Park – Hwange National Park

Distance travelled: +/-450 km

Approx driving day: Half day

This morning we have the opportunity to try further activities before we leave the Antelope Park and head for the world famous Hwange National Park. Zimbabwe’s largest and best known game park was (in early 19<sup>th</sup> century) the royal hunting grounds of the Ndebele warrior-king Mzilikazi and in 1929 was set aside as a National Park. The Park covers an area of over 14,600 sq kms and is particularly known for its elephant populations. We take a night game drive in a game concession area adjacent to the National Park where we search for a variety of nocturnal animals including the ever elusive leopard.

**Wow Factors:** *Antelope Park optional activities, Hwange National Park, Evening game drive*

**Accommodation:** *Camping twin share dome tents with shared facilities*

**Meals included:** *Breakfast, Dinner*

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### Day 13:

#### Hwange National Park

Distance travelled: 0kms

Approx driving day: Morning and afternoon game drives

Today we transfer to open safari vehicles and enter the Hwange National Park. Located in the far west of the country, Hwange sits in a remarkable belt of Africa, extending into neighbouring

Botswana allowing animals, especially elephant, to roam between Hwange and Chobe national Parks. As well as elephant the park contains over 100 mammal species including Africa’s “Big 5” (leopard, lion, elephant, rhino and buffalo), giraffe, cheetah, gemsbok and the brown hyena. The park is also renowned for its population of Wild (Painted) Dog. Unfortunately the numbers of these animals are dwindling but conservation efforts have been stepped up and we will see the work of one of these projects the following day. There will be a morning game drive, after which we return to camp for lunch and to relax through the heat of the day. Later in the afternoon we head out again for another game drive hoping to glimpse wildlife not seen earlier. We return to camp at dusk for overnight.

**Wow Factors:** *Hwange National Park, Morning and afternoon game drives*

**Accommodation:** *Camping twin share dome tents with shared facilities*

**Meals included:** *Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner*

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### Day 14:

#### Hwange National Park – Victoria Falls

Distance travelled: +/-200km

Approx driving day: Half day

Our final day is spent returning to Victoria Falls. On the way we visit the Hwange Painted Dog Conservation Project. Here we see the efforts made to rehabilitate and release injured and orphaned wild-dog. This is extremely valuable work on a species thought to number a mere 3000 remaining individuals in all of Africa. We then continue to the ‘Falls’ but keep a look out and frequent sightings of wildlife can be seen on and alongside the road. Arrangements end upon arrival in Victoria Falls but be sure to allow some extra time here to enjoy the spectacular ‘Falls’ themselves and the mighty Zambezi River.

**Wow Factors:** *Painted Dog Research Project, Roaming wildlife, Victoria Falls*

**Accommodation:** *None*

**Meals included:** *Breakfast*

### PRE TOUR ACCOMMODATION

This tour departs Victoria Falls at 10:00am on day 1; we strongly recommend therefore that you plan to arrive the day before departure to overcome any jet-lag and acclimatise to Africa. We would be happy to book pre-tour accommodation for you – please call or email us (or speak to your agent) with your arrival details and accommodation requirements.

However please book early to avoid disappointment and the risk of having to find more expensive (or less convenient) lodgings.

If time allows, we also suggest planning a night or two extra (after your tour) to make the most of Victoria Falls and the surrounding area.

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### WHAT TO BRING

Please try to keep your luggage to a minimum, bearing in mind that most airlines impose a 20kg luggage limit. A large soft holdall or backpack and a smaller day pack is ideal. On tour you will need a mixture of lightweight clothing for the day and warm wear (eg fleece, long trousers, hat) for early mornings and evenings or on game drives when it can be cool (especially in southern hemisphere winter months Jun-Aug). Pack a light rain jacket and bring mosquito spray. Bring a sleeping bag, towel and a pillow if required. A money belt/pouch that can be worn comfortably beneath your clothing is recommended. Please avoid bringing unnecessary valuables and use hotel safe to store your cash, passport and air tickets.

### VACCINATIONS / HEALTH

The table below indicates the vaccinations suggested for travel on this tour but **should be treated as a guide only**. You should seek professional medical advice from your GP or clinic at least six weeks prior to departure. Please note some areas visited are **malarial**. We recommend you speak to your doctor or travel clinic about appropriate anti-malarial tablets.

**NB** The above is a guide only. Please check all visa requirements at least one month in advance of travel. Most nationalities do not need to obtain any of the above visas in advance. They are available at the border entry points and payable in US\$ cash.

### MONEY MATTERS

#### PERSONAL EXPENSES

Naturally you will require extra money for your own personal spending on the tour, for snacks, drinks, souvenirs, tips and items of a personal nature. Everybody has different spending habits but as a guideline we suggest you budget US\$10-15 per day. Some spending will be in Botswana Pula (for incidental expenses along the way, optional activities, most additional accommodation before/after the trip) but it's a good idea to bring along some US\$ cash for any international airport taxes or visas. Only Botswana Pula is accepted in Botswana. Don't forget to allow money for before and after the tour if you are spending time in Victoria Falls.

- **Spending money** is best carried as cash in either South Africa Rand cash or US dollars, Sterling or Euro which can be exchanged into Botswana Pula on arrival and as you travel. Your guide will give general guidance about spending during the tour.
- **Currencies** are as follows: US Dollar, Botswana Pula
- **ATM machines** are found in Victoria Falls, Kasane and in Maun, Botswana although may be unreliable (so we ask that you please do not rely on them)



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- **Credit cards** can be used to pay for some optional activities although fees for use may be higher than you are accustomed to at home.
- **Travellers cheques** can be difficult to cash but make suitable emergency funds.

### TIPPING

As in many areas where tourism is an important contributor to the economy it has become customary to offer a small gratuity to local staff at the end of the tour if service has been of a high standard. Naturally this always remains at your discretion.
