A short safari to three of Kenya's best known game reserves. Visit the Northern Frontier District, the Great Rift Valley, rolling grasslands of the Masai Mara National Reserve, and Lake Nakuru National Park Rift Valley.



INTENDED ITINERARY

Whilst it is our intention to adhere to the route described below, there is a certain amount of flexibility built into the tour and on occasion it may be necessary or desirable to make alterations to the published itinerary. **This tour is operated in association with a local operator. Acacia is proud to be working with local companies supporting local communities.**

DAY 1 - 2
Samburu Game Reserve
B (day 2) Lx2 Dx2
Camping (basic standard)

We leave Nairobi and journey north, passing the iconic snow-capped Mt Kenya and wheat and dairy farmlands before the landscape begins to change and we enter the semi-arid Northern Frontier District. Descending off Kenya's central highlands we pass through Isiolo eventually reaching the Samburu National Reserve.

Our campsite is set up near the Ewaso Nyiro river (sometimes written as Uaso Ngiro, 'dark waters'), a simple camp setting with basic facilities. Depending on road conditions we arrive in the early afternoon, perhaps in time for a siesta during the heat of the day. Later, we will take our first game drive in this (normally) arid but beautiful national reserve. Catching sight of your first lion – or elephant - is an exciting experience but Samburu also contains rare and endemic species such as the reticulated giraffe, 'Grevy's' zebra, the Beisa oryx, the Somali ostrich and the gerenuk as well as antelope, and abundant birdlife. By the time the sun edges toward the horizon most of the group will be looking forward to dinner and we return to camp for the evening and overnight.

We spend the following day in the Reserve, usually dividing the day into morning and afternoon gamedrives with a rest during the heat of the middle day.

DAY 3
Great Rift Valley, Lake Baringo

Tourist class hotel/camp

This morning we return south, passing back through Isiolo and around the 'shoulder' of Mt Kenya, before turning

off to Thompson Falls and the Great Rift Valley. Lake Baringo is one of two freshwater lakes in the Rift Valley and is home to crocodile, hippo and over 400 species of birds. The lake is also well stocked with fish, so much so that the local people – the Njemps – say the crocodiles are so well fed (on fish) that they have forgotten the taste of mammal flesh! We have the afternoon here and the option of hiring a boat for a cruise on the lake (see below for costs) to view some of the wildlife. Alternatively enjoy a guided nature walk around the lake shore. The evening is spent at our tourist class hotel for dinner and overnight.

DAY 4
Lake Bogoria and Lake Nakuru National Park

Permanent tent with bed

We leave Lake Baringo and drive back down the Rift Valley to visit the Lake Bogoria. This shallow alkali lake is 'taster' for our visit to Nakuru later in the day. Flamingo and cormorants reside here – and if time allows we see some hot springs (sorry, no swimming). Further down the Rift Valley we come to one of the jewels in Kenya's crown - Lake Nakuru National Park.

Dominated by its central alkaline lake the park is home to abundant birdlife, in particular flamingos which feed on the blue-green algae that live in the strongly alkali waters. At times these birds gather in such numbers as to form a pink 'fringe' to the lake shore. Our game driving encircles the lake giving ample opportunity to view the wildlife. Birds you may see include flamingos, pelicans, storks, ibis, kingfishers, jacanas, rollers, and the glossy starling. Larger game present in the park include rhino, buffalo, zebra, impala, colobus monkey, and the rare Rothschild giraffe. More difficult to see but present nevertheless are the more elusive leopard (normally nocturnal) and lion.

We leave the park and make our way to the nearby Nakuru for our tourist class hotel accommodation / (alternatively we travel the short distance to Lake Elementeita to our camp for dinner and overnight.)

DAYS 5/6
Masai Mara National Reserve
Bx2 Lx2 Dx2
Permanent Tent with bed

We rise early to depart for the Masai Mara. This is a long (ish) drive crossing the valley and passing through the Masai town of Narok and the remote and windy Loita Hills to Kenya's south-western area. As we approach the Reserve we may see wildlife from the main road even though we are still well outside the park boundaries. Eventually we arrive at camp a few hundred metres outside the park boundary. There is time to enjoy lunch and perhaps a short siesta before we have our first game drive.

We spend the next three days in and around the Masai Mara. There is usually time for two game drives/ day (morning and afternoon) with time to relax at camp in middle of the day (when most wildlife is less active). The landscape in the Reserve accords with many people's idea of 'classic' Africa: rolling grasslands, open vistas, distant horizons, and herds of zebra, antelope, giraffe and many other large mammals. The 'Big Five' (elephant, rhino, buffalo, lion and leopard) are found here and we would hope to see at least some of these. If you are travelling between June and October you may see one of nature's most inspiring spectacles: the annual migration of thousands of grazing animals (mainly wildebeest and zebra) as they move from the dry southern Serengeti in the south north in search of the fresher greener grasses of the 'Mara'. The number and concentration of grazing animals attracts predators (lion, leopard amongst others) hoping for some 'easy pickings', and following them, nature's 'scavengers' (hyena, vultures). This is an inspiring sight the precise time varies slightly from year to year and such is the wealth of the wildlife, the 'Mara' is worth visiting at any time of year, and the two days we have here provides a worthwhile insight into this marvellous Reserve.

The Masai Mara area is the traditional homeland for the local Maasai people. In colonial times the Maasai were a warlike tribe, and in many ways they still resist the influx of western culture, their distinctive dress and way of life setting them apart from many other Kenyan peoples. In recent years however the Maasai have become reconciled to the growth of tourism and indeed learned to benefit from it, having control over the administration of the Masai Mara Reserve. Time permitting it may also be possible to arrange a (optional) visit to one of the local manyattas (villages) to gain an insight into their traditional way of life.

DAY 7
Nairobi

We leave the Mara this morning and head back past the Loita Hills and Rift Valley to Nairobi. Time allowing (and on request) we may stop along the way to browse at local craft markets where you can pick up some last minute souvenirs (bargain hard!). Our normal time of return to Nairobi is early/mid afternoon.

TOUR INFORMATION

TOUR STYLE

Acacia Small Group Safari. These are designed for those who like adventurous travel with camping but on a smaller scale and more focused on a particular area, than Acacia's larger Overland groups. Campsites vary in standard but are generally clean and secure with washing and toilet facilities. However due to some lack of infrastructure locally they may in some areas and at certain times of year experience shortages of some facilities or supplies.

Accommodation varies from camping (all equipment is provided) to small locally owned tourist class hotels.

Our Small Group safaris are operated by a locally based (African) ground handler who has maintained standards at a high level over a period of time. We believe that working with a local operator in this way assists the community to benefit in a sustainable way from tourism. At the same time it provides our clients with the extensive local knowledge and enthusiasm of the local staff and guides employed to ensure your safari is as enjoyable as it is memorable.

WHAT'S INCLUDED

Tour highlights, transport, accommodation, bed and bedding, camping equipment, park fees, meals as indicated, services of an English speaking guide/driver.

WHAT'S NOT INCLUDED

Visas, travel insurance, flights, airport transfers, optional activities, laundry, gratuities, passport & visa fees, drinks & items of a personal nature.

ACCOMMODATION

Camping is twin share permanent tents with beds and bedding provided. Camps have showers and running water. The tents are pre-erected, with bedding and simple bath room facilities attached. Accommodation at Baringo and Nakuru is in small privately owned tourist class hotel.

Acacia would be pleased to reserve pre /post tour accommodation in Nairobi - please see below.

MEALS

Meals included are – Breakfast (B) x6, Lunch (L) x6, Dinner (D) x6

These meals are prepared in camp by the tour crew, although help washing plates at the end of meals may be invited. Most dietary requirements can be catered for but please ensure you inform Acacia of any special requirements when you book or at your earliest convenience.

TRANSPORT

Minibus with pop-up roof for game viewing. Please note that some of the roads in Kenya are in a very poor state of repair. Driving can sometimes therefore be slow and bumpy! Your driver will do his best to make your safari as comfortable as possible but your patience at such times is much appreciated.

TOUR PREPARATION

BOOKING INFORMATION

When you make a confirmed booking for your tour you will be sent pre-departure information and related documents. Once you have paid in full you will receive a Travel Voucher giving full details of your joining point. Nairobi is well served by a variety of airlines. Your travel agent can advise on flights to and from the start and finish of your tour.

PRE/POST TOUR ACCOMMODATION

This tour departs Nairobi on day 1; we strongly recommend therefore that you plan to arrive the day before departure to overcome any jet-lag and to acclimatise to Africa. We would be happy to book pre-tour

accommodation for you – please call or email us (or speak to your agent) with your arrival details and accommodation requirements.

However please book early to avoid disappointment and the risk of having to find more expensive (or less convenient) lodgings.

If time allows, you may wish to plan a night or two after your tour in Nairobi. The Kenyan capital is a bustling city with shops, restaurants, markets to explore. There is a national park on the outskirts of town – you can book morning (or afternoon) game drives - and one or two small but interesting museums.

WHAT TO BRING

Please try to keep your luggage to a minimum, bearing in mind that most airlines impose a 20kg luggage limit. A large soft holdall or backpack and a smaller day pack is ideal. On this tour you should bring a mixture of lightweight, cool clothing for the day and warm clothing (ie fleece, long trousers and hat) for mornings and evenings as it can be cool then and on morning game drives. Pack a light rain jacket. Mosquito spray or repellent is recommended throughout the year. A small pair of binoculars and a camera with a good zoom is recommended for game viewing. A money belt/pouch, worn under the clothing is also a good idea. Please avoid bringing unnecessary valuables and use your hotel safe wherever possible to store cash and valuables.

VACCINATIONS/HEALTH

The table below indicates the vaccinations suggested for travel on this tour but **should be treated as a guide only**. You should seek professional medical advice from your GP or clinic at least six weeks prior to departure.

Please note Kenya is a **malarial** area; we strongly recommend you consult your doctor for appropriate anti malarial prophylactics (as well as precautions against the other diseases mentioned above)

VISA REQUIREMENTS

The table below indicates the visas required for travel to the countries on this tour but **should be treated as a guide only**. At least one month prior to travel seek confirmation from embassies or a visa specialist, that these requirements are still current. For UK citizens the Foreign & Commonwealth Office (FCO) offers free up-to-date travel info: www.fco.gov.uk .

For other nationalities a number of travel advice websites are listed on the Acacia website. Currently (Mar 11) the Kenyan visa is available for most nationalities on arrival at Nairobi's Jomo Kenyatta International Airport. The price for most nationalities is USD 50 (USD cash only).

MONEY MATTERS

PERSONAL EXPENSES

Naturally you will require extra money for your own personal spending on the tour, for snacks, drinks, souvenirs, tips and items of a personal nature. Everybody has different spending habits but as a guideline we

suggest you budget US\$10-15 per day. Also keep US\$ cash for relevant airport taxes and visas needed, optional activities (see below) and any additional accommodation before or after your tour.

- **Spending money** is best carried as cash in US dollars which you exchange into the local currency (Kenya Shilling) on arrival or at your hotel.
- **Money Exchange:** Adequate spending money should be changed in Nairobi as money changing facilities are minimal outside the city. Please note - bring US dollars cash in **clean, un-torn post-2005 bills** as old, dirty bills may not be accepted. Small denomination notes are often subject to lower exchange rates.
- **Currency:** Kenyan Shilling
- **ATM machines** are found in Nairobi and Nairobi airport, although are not always reliable (and we therefore recommend you do not rely on them). They will only provide you with Kenya Shillings (they will **not** allow you to draw Sterling or US dollars cash).
- **Credit cards** may be used in Nairobi although charges are high (3-5% by Western standards).
- **Travellers cheques** may be encashed in Nairobi (airport, hotel, banks) – although you may need to show your receipt for purchase – but are very difficult to use outside the capital.

It is recommended you bring your money in a mixture of ways (cash, credit card, Travellers' cheques)

TIPPING

As in many areas where tourism is an important contributor to the economy, it has become customary, provided you find the services rendered satisfactory, to give a small gratuity to hospitality staff in return. The amount is always a matter for you as client but as a guide you may wish to consider a figure of between \$5 - \$10/person/day for your driver/guide and perhaps around \$1-\$2/person/day for a cook or camp staff (if applic).

LOCAL PAYMENT

Local Payment is an amount paid by you to your guide / local representative on arrival on tour. It is usually collected on the first day of the tour. It is a way of allowing your guide tour funds which will be used by them to run the itinerary. Please bring it in **high denomination clean, un-torn post-2005 US dollar bills**.

In order to give you maximum flexibility on tour we offer a number of optional activities on the tour. To help budget, approximate prices are listed below (subject to change and availability).

INSURANCE

Your guide may ask you for a copy of your policy when you join the tour. We recommend you leave a copy of the policy with a friend or the person nominated as your emergency contact.
